Our course provides valuable skills toward running your own practice or sets you on the pathway to becoming an accredited remedial massage therapist. You will gain a wealth of theoretical knowledge and practical experience that will put you in good stead when you complete your course. Our HLT42015 Certificate IV in Massage Therapy opens the door to a wide range of career options – both Australia-wide and globally.

This course is a great entry point for those that want to "test the waters" in a career as a massage therapist. Others may choose the Certificate IV as an add-on to another profession or, to practise as a massage therapist whilst completing another qualification. The biggest advantage about the HLT42015 Certificate IV in Massage Therapy is that you'll be generating an income as a massage therapist in 6 months. It is important to note that those with HLT42015 Certificate IV in Massage Therapy do not qualify for health fund rebates. For this you will need a HLT52015 Diploma of Remedial Massage or perhaps you would like to pathway to completing a Bachelor of Health Science (Myotherapy) degree.

Course Duration

- 6 months full time: 24 contact hours per week (2 x 10 week terms)
- 1 year part time: 12 contact hours per week (4 x 10 week terms)

Study Mode

Face-to-face on campus with selected subjects available online. See the course structure opposite for online availability.

Entry Requirements

Endeavour College is a direct entry institution. Students will need to provide one of the following:

- A copy of a Senior Secondary Certificate of Education (i.e. a Year 12 qualification) or
- A copy of a higher level qualification completed or successful completion of 1 year FTE or
- Achieve competency in Exit Level 3 score and working at Level 4 within the Australian Core Skills Framework assessments in Reading and Numeracy

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

Students may apply for RPL based on relevant work experience and educational history.

Payment

Total course cost \$4,998*.

> Full time study – \$2,499 per term

> Part time study - \$1,249.5 per term

Upfront payments by term are required; payment plans (direct debit) and 3rd party loans available.

Classes

Classes are taught by experts who are highly trained in their fields and who bring their own clinical experience to provide context to foundational and therapeutic studies.

Practical Classes

Students must be physically capable of completing clinical components of the course. To support learning, students attend practical classes where they are expected to practice interviewing and case assessment techniques as well as physical clinical examination and treatment procedures. This is conducted under the supervision of qualified instructors and with respect for privacy, cultural and religious differences.

Teaching Clinics

Students gain clinical experience at Endeavour Wellness Clinics under the supervision of qualified practitioners. Our busy clinics provide the opportunity to develop and hone all skills required to run a successful clinic after graduation, including client assessment and management, client recruitment and continuity of care, and customer service.

Clinical Hours

Students will spend a minimum of 90 hours in clinic.

Assessments

Undertaking assessments is a part of educational study and provides students with the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and skills against the unit of study and the relevant units of competency requirements. Assessments in this course are competency based and may be, but not limited to: assignments, quizzes, exams, practical and clinical demonstrations, tutorial and forum participation. Students enrolled in online units may be required to undertake assessments at the College where required.

Career Opportunities

When you become a massage therapist, a range of career opportunities are available to you. These include operating your own business or working within health retreats, cruise liners and spas. Graduates often choose to practice as sole traders, as a part of a multidisciplinary practice or establish a partnership with other healthcare professionals or beauty therapists.
